
#### **Happy Easter**


Wow, is it really Easter already. I can't believe we are heading into the final term of the year. Time has literally flown by.


## More success for Teo!

Recently Teo competed at London Lee Valley Athletic Centre, where he represented the Winchester Athletic Club in the year 4 and 5, 60m, 200m and 600m run. He did extremely well in his runs, but especially in 200m where he was 2nd out of 60 runners and secured a personal best of 30.22s. After combining all of his points he received a gold medal.

8th place/54 runners in 60m 9.21s (2nd in y4)
2nd place/60 runners in 200m 30.22s (1st in y4)
6th place/29 runners in 600m 1.59.21m (4th in y4)

Teo has been also selected for the U11 Wessex League Squad, and is going to compete against 24 other athletic clubs within Hampshire, Dorset, IOW, Wiltshire and Surrey in 4 league matches.

The first competition is in Winchester on the 2nd of June.


